Join the School of Archaeology for an afternoon of metal at the Pitt Rivers Museum!

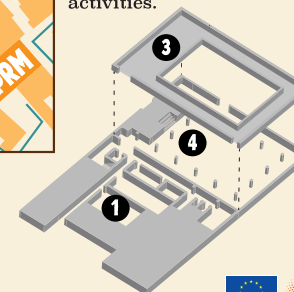
Learn about the origins and ancient production of metals. Find out why metals and their ores are so special, and consider how their importance for human society has changed over the last 10,000 years.
